At this point of the meeting, Nancy Sigmund, Director of Math and Computer Science, began her presentation on the math curriculum in the district. Covered topics included mathematics assessments test designs, Standard 3: Mathematics, key ideas, sample math problems for grades k-12 and current updates. Questions from the Board and residents were answered.

Mr. Alan Yu, representative from Coughlin Foundotos Cullen & Danowski, LLP, the district's external auditing firm, gave his report on the district's Audit Report as of June 2007. He explained what auditor's responsibilities are: reviewing financial statements, testing and evidential testing, giving a clean opinion (highest level of assurance) and reviewing internal controls, then gives their recommendations for improvement. The district is fiscally sound.

Under **REPORT OF COMMITTEES** – Student Representative, Ailin Lian, covered the upcoming winter concert, the Marching Band Festival, Key Club's collection of food for the needy during Thanksgiving season, visits from Carolyn McCarthy and Bobby Petrichelli, the girls' basketball team playing at Madison Square Garden and the Student Council's successful Halloween party for the children in the district.

Mr. Mariano gave a brief report on the recent Health and Safety Committee meeting that was very productive and went well. Principals of the buildings were also in attendance and

spoke about their emergency procedures at each school. The committee is discussing having monthly or bi-monthly meetings.

Mr. Whelpley spoke on his recent fiscal oversight workshop that he attended along with Mr. Kaye. Covered topics of the workshop included fraud, waste and fiscal fitness. Mr. Brita added that elected officials do not need to attend meetings like these, but Board officials do.

Mr. Trocchia discussed his and Mr. Kaye's attendance at County Executive

Tom Suozzi's meeting to update school board members and PTAs on county efforts regarding school business functions on November 14th. The purpose of the function is to try and consolidate 20% of school district budgets, which include insurance, IT infrastructure and other district costs. Forty-one districts turned out for the meeting. Mr. Kaye handed out an update to that meeting. Ms. Lotito inquired as to the feasibility of consolidating various services such as sanitation, library, fire districts and the business functions of school districts.
